


John Forde. For the latter exhibit, a catalogue that features the photographs in the exhibit as well as many others, is now available in our gift shop.

Opening April 2 will be a new traveling exhibit from the Legacy of Hope Foundation, called *Indian Day Schools in Canada: An Introduction* which used archival documents and photographs to tell the story of these schools and their impact on Indigenous peoples across Canada.

Opening in June 2024 is a new exhibit on artist Susan Ross and writer
Sheila Burnford. This exhibit will highlight their friendship and their fascinating travels through Northern
Ontario as well as the Arctic. The exhibit will display a variety of Susan's artwork through the stages in her
career, as well as objects from Sheila's literary career.





The Museum has recently partnered with the Port Arthur Rotary club to develop an exhibit reflecting their 100th anniversary this year, that is on display now on our first floor. This exhibit features fascinating items from the club's history, including an axe original to the construction of the Outlaw Bridge. The



Presentation Description:

It has been an eventful century. From its roots in the Great War and interwar years, through the challenges of the Second World War and Cold War, and its subsequent roles in support of Canada, NATO,



and the UN, the RCAF has seen good times and bad. This talk explores the history of the RCAF through a number of innocuous

objects - a Group of Seven painting, a German Gotha bomber pilot's helmet, a battered leather suitcase, and others that provide a window into the known and unknown stories of the Air Force.
